

Student Immunization Record

Important information to read and submit

The [Immunizations of School Pupils Act](#) requires every student attending school in Ontario to submit up-to-date immunization records as per [Ontario's immunization requirements](#) or provide a valid [exemption](#) form to Public Health. Public Health will be contacting parents/guardians of students under 16 years and students if 16 years and older for whom they do not have up-to-date vaccination records or a valid exemption.

Students who do not comply with this process will be suspended from school

If a student is missing one or more of the required vaccines as per [Ontario's immunization requirements](#), they should get up to date on the missing vaccines in their country of origin. If they have already arrived in Ontario, they can contact Wellington-Dufferin-Guelph Public Health at 1-800-265-7293 ext. 7006 to book an appointment to update vaccine(s).

Ontario Immunization Requirements:

Vaccine	Dosage	Guidelines
Polio (IPV / OPV)	4-5 doses	At least 4 doses; with one dose given after 4 th birthday
Diphtheria - Tetanus - Pertussis (DTP)	4-5 doses	At least 4 doses; with one dose given after the 4 th birthday; and one dose within the last 10 years
Meningococcal Conjugate ACYW-135 <i>*students in grade 7-12</i>	1 dose	On or after 1 year of age
Meningococcal Conjugate C <i>*students in JK- grade 6</i>	1 dose	On or after 1 year of age
Measles (Rubeola)	2 doses	On or after 1 year of age
Rubella (German measles)	1 dose	On or after 1 year of age
Mumps	2 doses	On or after 1 year of age
Varicella	2 doses	If born in 2010 or after

If a student requires vaccine(s) please note there is no minimum age of consent for medical treatment in Ontario. If a nurse or physician assesses that the student understands the benefits and risks of the vaccine(s) then the student is able to provide consent.
